

Unfortunately this type of event is far from an original concept. The cocaine fueled ego fest known as 'The Oscars' is hardly the most credible platform, yet somehow comment threads across the known world are alive with various knee jerk reactions. From visceral attacks on the infidelity perpetrated by Pinkett Smith with <u>August Alsina</u>, to enthusiastic diatribes condemning any form of violence as barbarism.
